A brief review of USA Christmas Stamps: The first
stamp for Christmas was issued by USPS on Nov. 1, 1962. It depicted a Christmas wreath and candles (a contemporary design ). USPS has issued contemporary design Christmas stamps annually ever since. Beginning in 1965 (with 3 exceptions ) USPS also issued a traditional (religiousthemed) Christmas stamp ( predominantly featuring the "M adonna and Child" ). These Christmas themed stamps were joined in 1996 with an annual holiday stamp for Hannakkah (the first one a joint issue with Israel) and later holiday stamps for Kwanzaa, Eid and Chinese New Year. For 2015 USPS issued two new Christmas contemporary designs, a series of ten stamps from CBS' 1965 television holiday special, A Charlie Brown Christmas and Geometric Snowflakes in purple, pink, blue and green, but no new "faith oriented" design

It is time for an update on the upright Jenny Invert stamp panes that USPS issued in 2013.
Linn's Stamp News \& Insights recently reported that USPS has registered purchases and issued certificates to three people for the upright $\$ 2$ Jenny Invert stamp panes. That brings the total USPS has issued certificates for to 24 . That's only about $25 \%$ of the up-

right Jenny Invert stamp panes that USPS had intentionally printed. Linn's believes more of these stamp panes have been found but people have not officially notified the USPS about them and the total found could be up to 29.
Toward the end of October one of the upright Inverted Jenny stamp panes that had been given a superb rating of 98 by Professional Stamp Experts was sold at a Kelleher auction for \$67,850

USPS hasn't sold all of the $\$ 2$ Inverted Jenny stamp panes yet, so, you still have a chance to purchase one of the possible remaining 70 upright stamp panes.
