11:00 AM	Madagascar: 150 Years of Political and Philatelic Turmoil	Madagascar experienced decades during the 19th century when private mail effectively ceased. The 1860s reopening of the island was followed by periodic mail service interruptions resulting in short-lived local posts, frequent postage shortages, and related philatelic anomalies. Many of these problems persisted into the 20th century.	Robert Mustacich
12 noon	United States 1928 – 1960 Mail for St. Pierre and Miquelon via <i>The Gull</i> Fast Train through Maritime Canada	During this period all United States mail addressed to SPM was directed to the Boston P.O. Foreign Section. There the mail was dispatched aboard the Boston & Maine Railroad express train <i>The Gull</i> . We can trace the mailbags as they traveled the routes of several railroads through Maritime Canada and then connected with the steamship <i>Belle Isle</i> . Registered mailbags required strict security and proof of receipt to the Boston Foreign Section by the SPM Colonial	Jim Taylor

		liberation series of French postage stamps. Guns were still echoing in the streets of Paris in August 1944 when Pierre Gandon perfected "Marianne of the Barricades." The inspirational "Marianne" decorated millions of mailing pieces and stamp album pages as France rebuilt following the War.
