Here is some stamp trivia you may not know about. The largest and smallest post offices in the world are located in the USA.

The world's largest post office is the head post office in Chicago, Illinois. The smallest post office in the world is located in Ochopee, Florida.

Can you believe cats were used to deliver the mail!

I have heard of many different types of animals being used to deliver mail - camels, reindeer, horses, dogs, pigeons but CATS? Well it's true. In 1879 the city of Liege in Belgium employed 37 cats to carry bundles of letters to villages. This service didn't last long though as the cats prove to be thoroughly undisciplined.

Great Britain is the only country which issues its stamps without its name printed on them.

All Universal Postal Union member countries are required to have their country name in Latin letters on stamps intended for international mail. The United Kingdom of Great Britain (England, Wales and Scotland), also known as UK or Great Britain, however was granted an exemption in 1874 from this requirement and instead has the profile of the British monarch on its stamps because Great Britain was the very first country to issue pre-paid postage stamps. In 1921 the United Kingdom of Great Britain expanded to include newly formed Northern Ireland when Ireland was partitioned.
