#### Stamp of the Month by your newsletter editor

The September 2017 issue of *The American Philatelist* has an article about words on stamps. Did you know The Guinness World Records' website states that the stamp issued by Belgian Post Group in honor of International Women's Day in 2014 currently holds the record with 606 words on one stamp. The stamp depicts the face of a women made up entirely of tiny words. Next month (Oct. 27) the United Nations Postal Administration will issue a three-stamp souvenir sheet. Each stamp will have the entire text of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights with its preamble in English. One stamp will be denominated in USA currency, one in Swiss currency and the other in Austrian currency. These three countries host the three main headquarters for the United Nations. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights, including preamble, will be spread over 60 lines of microprinting on each stamp. The document is reported to be made up of 1,778 words. Once the stamp is issued Guinness World Records judges will examine the stamps and determine the word count for each stamp. Even though the text will be in English, on the USA denominated stamp title of the document will be in English. The Swiss denominated stamp will have the title in French. The Austrian denominated stamp will have the title in German. So the number of words that make up each title could be different. Which one of the three stamps do you think will be the new world record holder?

You might take on as a challenge to yourself to purchase the souvenir sheet and then blow up each of the stamps to make the words legible. Do you own word count and then see if you agree with what the Guinness World Records posts in its next edition.

#### Update on the Legends of Hollywood

The U.S. Postal Service's Legends of Hollywood series began in 1995 with the 32¢ Marilyn Monroe stamp. So far 20 people have been honored in the Legends of Hollywood series. The 20<sup>th</sup> stamp in the series was a forever stamp issued in 2016 for Shirley Temple. With no announcement about another Legends of Hollywood stamp since 2016, *Linn's Stamps News* decided to query the USPS about continuing the series. The reply from USPS was "If and/or when we have something to announce regarding stamps, we will announce it." So the status of this series is in limbo.
