Stamp News of the Month by your Newsletter Editor

The Postal Regulatory Commission has approved the price increases that USPS proposed back in October. The new prices follow. Take note the prices for some classes of mail did not change. The new prices go into effect on January 21.

First Class Mail Forever stamps are for letters up to one ounce and their price will go from 49¢ each to 50¢ each. Additional ounce stamps for letters will stay at 21¢ each. Letters (metered) will go from 46ϕ each to 47ϕ each. International letters up to one ounce will stay at \$1.15. Domestic postcards will go from 34¢ each to 35¢ each.

Prices changes for Priority Mail flat rate products are:

Small flat rate boxes will go from \$7.15 each to \$7.20 each. Medium flat rate boxes will go from \$13.60 each to \$13.65 each Large flat rate boxes will go from \$18.85 each to \$18.90 each. APO/FPO large flat rate boxes will go from \$17.35 each to \$17.40 each.

Regular flat rate envelope will go from \$6.65 each to \$6.70 each Legal flat rate envelopes will go from \$6.95 each to \$6.70 each. Padded flat rate envelope will go from \$7.20 each to \$7.25 each.

Prices for retail Priority Mail Express will increase on average 3.9%.
