**Social Philately** is a currently trending study area which is rooted in traditional postal history. There are even subdivisions within social philately, such as studying the life and achievements of the **addressee**, and also studying the contents of the letter or postcard. Previous articles published in the Atlanta club newsletter illustrated these concepts by: (a) publishing a study of **Thomas Elliot Harrison**, a prominent Victorian civil engineer (**July 2020** newsletter), and (b) also publishing the contents of an entire letter describing life in a Victorian Scottish mental health institution (**February 2021** newsletter).

A <u>third</u> subdivision of Social Philately is the study of what events happened on the day of a particular postmark cancellation or transit marking, or even the dated contents. In other words, **SOCIAL PHILATELY ON THIS DAY**.

The following is a **case study** example of such an "**on this day**" study:

The image opposite is the cancellation applied to a Great Britain Queen Victoria **Penny Pink** postal stationery item which carries the embossed indicium image of Victoria. The envelope was mailed from **NEWCASTLE-ON-TYNE** to London. The date of cancellation is shown as **MR 3 1857**, i.e. **March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1857** (**Tuesday**).

So the **SOCIAL PHILATELY** question now becomes: what significant events happened on this given date, preferably related to the addressee, city or country of origination or destination?

## **METHODS of RESEARCH:**

The methods of research can begin with extensive internet searches. Newspaper and parliamentary archives online can be particularly useful. Additionally, local libraries can also be useful resources.

## **OUTCOME of RESEARCH:**

SECOND OPIUM WAR: Great Britain and France formally declare war on China

### The SECOND OPIUM WAR:

**BACKGROUND:** Throughout the 1800s there were constant attempts at colonial expansion around the world by European empire-building imperial powers. The **Second Opium War** was the result of the ambition of Great Britain and France to win additional commercial trading privileges in China. This included the legalization of the opium trade, as well as to gain more legal and territorial concessions in China. Britain and France already had existing rights in China.

**TIMELINE:** Hostilities took place between **08OCT1856** and **24OCT1860**, even <u>before</u> war was formally declared on **03MAR1857**.

**PARTICIPANTS:** Great Britain and France were allies, in conflict with China. The United States was involved in a minor concurrent conflict in China during the war, but they ignored Great Britain's offer of an alliance and did not coordinate with the Anglo-French forces.

**CAUSES:** The opium export trade from **British-occupied India** to China was very important to the **British** national economy. Additionally, the recreational and medical use of opium in Victorian Britain was very popular. Britain fought **two** wars in the mid-1800s, known as the **Opium Wars**,

basically in support of free opium trade, against Chinese import restrictions, but in reality because of the huge profits to be made in the export of opium to China (i.e. **money**).

**OUTCOME:** On **240CT1860** China conceded to the Allies demands.

## **CONCLUSION:**

**Social Philately** is an evolving and trending study area of postal history. The traditional study of rates and routes is a critical aspect of postal history, but **Social Philately** fulfills the remit of not only the what, when and how, but also the **WHO**.

<u>Announcing</u> **VIRTUAL STAMPEX 2023**. The virtual Stampex show will return this year, from **04MAY2023** to **06MAY2023** (Thursday – Friday – Saturday), for a <u>continuous</u> seventy-two (72) hours of active on-line philately (covering all the world's time zones). This event has been timed to coincide with the forthcoming coronation of King Charles III, and also the anniversary of the May 6<sup>th</sup> 1840 first official usage of the **Penny Black**, the world's first postage stamp. The 2020 and 2021 iterations of the <u>VIRTUAL</u> Stampex shows attracted over 8,000 unique visitors from over one hundred (100) countries.

**VIRTUAL STAMPEX 2023** will host over fifty (**50**) dealer booths, an exhibition, and a series of talks and presentations. This show will be accessible from desktop PCs, laptops, smartphones and tablets.

This year's show will also feature a new virtual tool that allows attendees to meet and live video chat with other collectors and dealers. In addition, the show will offer live philatelic round tables, giving visitors a chance to connect in **real-time** with fellow collectors from around the world on popular topics. Fellow collectors can socialize using chat rooms, live chat and video calling. A personal virtual briefcase will enable visitors to email **FREE** catalogues, magazines, information packets and price lists back to themselves.
