A CROWN JEWEL

To mark the sixtieth anniversary of the Coronation of Her Majesty the Queen, Royal Mail (Great Britain) issued some commemorative stamps on **May 30**th **2013**, featuring a collection of some of the portraits of Queen Elizabeth II. The highest value of the set is shown below.

This highest value stamp was based on a portrait painted by Richard Stone in 1992, and it shows the Queen wearing a special crown (or "diadem") called the George IV State Diadem. This diadem, otherwise known as the Diamond Diadem, was made in 1820 for King George IV (1762 – 1830).

This diadem is worn by monarchs or their consorts in procession to coronations and also State Openings of Parliament.

The postage stamp image (**Figure 1.**) seen above is cropped from a full cover. This cover example was mailed from a small community sub-office in the UK (**OXFORD ST SUNDERLAND**), to the USA, and it is hand cancelled with **self-inking circular date stamp**. The city of Sunderland is located in the North East of England.

The two (2) images below show the **Diamond Diadem** previously being worn by an earlier monarch (**Queen Victoria**) and also **Queen Mary** – wife of **King George V**.

<u>NOTE</u>: The Queen Elizabeth II (Royal Portraits) set included six (6) stamps, of which this 1.88 GBP value (Figure 1.) was the highest value, which was primarily used for international mail. The stamp sizes are all 27 mm by 37 mm, and the perforations are all 14 by 14.
