BUILDING VICTORIAN POST OFFICES

Architecture should speak of its time and place, but yearn for timelessness – Frank Gehry Historically, the British Post Office was <u>not</u> responsible for the design and construction of its own buildings. Rather, it was the architects working within the **Office of Works** (1851 – 1940), and then subsequent government ministries who carried out this work. The post office architects were civil servants, so often very little is known about them. However thanks to surviving archive documentation, there is now some idea of who these architects were.

One such architect was James Williams (1824 – 1892). He was born on 20th January 1824. He entered the Office of Works in the late 1840s at the age of 24, and he was one of the main post office architects between 1859 and 1884. He was a Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects (F.R.I.B.A.).

He utilized a variety of architectural styles for various projects. For example, the Nottingham post office (1868) style was Italianate and the Sheffield post office (1871) was Free Classical style.

OBITUARY.

MR. James Williams, F.R.I.B.A. — The R.I.B.A. Journal announces the death, on the 9th inst., of Mr. James Williams, who will be remembered chiefly in connexion with many of the Post-offices erected in this country. Born January 20, 1824, he entered H.M. Office of Works at the age of twenty-four. In 1859, he was appointed Surveyor for the erection of Post-offices. Among the numerous buildings erected under his supervision may be mentioned the Post-offices at Manchester, Hull, Nottingham, Newcastle, Sheffield, and Bristol; in London the G.P.O. West, the Post-office in Bedford-street, and the Savings Bank, Queen Victoria-street.

Post Office Case Study: Darlington

This post office case study is of **Darlington**, which has the associated numeric allocation of **233**. The city is located in the North East of England.

It is not definitive who the architect was, but the body of evidence indicates that **James Williams** was responsible.

The post office was opened in the **mid-1860s**.




Figure 2. Map of Darlington (circa: 1858).

The building operated as a post office until the **1980s**. The street address is **28 – 32 Northgate**. The photographs below show the building functioning as a post office, and subsequently functioning as a retail clothing store.




Figure 3. Post Office Use.

Teamwork:

James Williams was only one of many semi-anonymous **Office of Works** Victorian architects that designed post offices.



The Office of Works was given its separate identity in 1851, derived from its precursor incarnation as the Office of Woods, Forests, Land Revenues, Works and Buildings. This refocusing of the department was legislated in order to bring the Office of Works under the direct control of the British Parliament.

OFFICE OF WORKS HISTORY

As the postal system expanded in the Victorian era, there was an ever increasing demand for post office infrastructure, which required a veritable team of architects. In conclusion, the **Office of Works** was a major contributor to the overall success of the British Victorian postal system.
