A horse, a horse, my kingdom for a horse – Richard III (William Shakespeare)

In 2014, Royal Mail (GB) issued a set of stamps celebrating working horses. The stamps featured images of various working horses.

The second highest value stamp of this set (the example shown in **Figure 1.**), showed an image of **Police Horses**.

Horses were first used by police forces in the late 18^{th} century in order to deal with highwaymen. The 21^{st} century police horse is essential to managing crowd dynamics.

The postmark was applied by the use of a **self-inking counter date stamp**. These date stamps were consistently 23 mm in diameter with a fancy "petal-style" edge.¹

THE MET

Statistics: The set included six (6) stamps, of which this **1.28 GBP** value was the second highest value, which was primarily used for international mail. **Size:** 41mm by 30mm. **Perforations:** 14.5 x 14. The stamp is printed by lithography.

NOTE: The modern London Metropolitan Police (**the Met**) Mounted Branch has eight (**8**) stables in London, and it was established as the modern branch in **1918**. The police horses used are typically half thoroughbred and half draft breed. **The Met** maintains and houses a minimum of one hundred (**100**) horses.
