Ugly Stamps By Steve Swain

Have you ever been standing in line at a post office and heard someone request "pretty" stamps from the window clerk? I have. A savvy window clerk will contend that all of the stamps are pretty. But have you ever heard anyone ask for ugly stamps? I have not. However, I'm certainly of the opinion that there are many "not pretty" stamps.

Of course, a play on the old saying that "beauty is in the eye of the beholder" is "ugly is in the eye of the beholder." It just depends on your criteria for "pretty" and "ugly." Relying on Webster's Dictionary, "ugly" is unpleasant or repulsive, especially in appearance; unattractive, unsightly, horrible, frightful, gruesome, foul, repugnant. Granted, some of these synonyms indeed stretch the definition of ugly somewhat, but you get the idea.

And this brings us to ugly stamps. We are not talking here about a stamp that was purposely designed to be unattractive. One such stamp (lower left) was issued by Great Britain in 1976 to honor Robert Owen, a 19th century social reformer who worked to improve the dreary lives and working conditions of children employed in textile mills. The stamp shows the working hands of a small child entrapped in the works of a giant steel loom. It is a creepy (ugly) stamp, designed that way to evoke an emotion from those who look at and use the stamp.







Nor are we referring to stamps whose theme is "ugly", such as the Great Britain issue commemorating the ugly sisters from Cinderella (above center) or the United Nations issue commemorating the children's story, The Ugly Duckling (above right).

I suggest that "ugly" stamps are those with an unattractive overall design or overly simplistic design, or those with ill-conceived color schemes (or lack thereof). A brief internet search offered the below stamps as meeting the "ugly" criteria.


