

  - 2) Russian postal stationery
- Other Russian Issues Used in Finland Co-Runners
  - 1) 1905 & 1914 / 1915 Charity Issues
  - 2) 1913 Romanov commemoratives
  - 3) Overprints, exchange stamps, imperforate stamps
  - 4) Other postal stationeries not sold by Finnish Post

# After UPU Generally Uncommon– Allowed in Finland Many Combinations Possible, Many Unknown



#### **Basic Mixed Franking Periods**

Domestic 1891 to 1917
To Russia May to December 1891
To abroad May 1891 to May 1911

#### **Cover Franking**

Russian 2 kopek 1909 pair = 10 penni Finnish 10 penni 1911 Domestic letter rate = 20 penni

#### **Postal Forms**

#### Money Orders – Address Cards - Telegrams





Left: Showcase stamps infrequently seen on letters: 25 and 70 kopek Russian definitive issues

**Right**: Showcase mixed currencies

6 Russian rubles paying for 1500 Finnish marks on domestic money order

5 ruble Russian issue known only on postal forms and postage due accounting forms

# **End of Kopek Franking**

- Russian revolutions of 1917 restoration of Finnish civil autonomy
- September 1917 kopek devaluation, Post's exchange losses
- Finnish Senate ends kopek franking on domestic mail 28 November 1917
- Independent Finland ends dual currencies and kopek franking on mail to abroad – 12 March 1918
